Madam

I am directed by the Secretary of State to reply to your application of 7 October 1969 to stay and work in the United Kingdom.

Under the Commonwealth Immigrants Act 1962, a Commonwealth citizen who wishes to come to the United Kingdom to settle and take employment must be in possession of an employment voucher before he arrives here, and I enclose an explanatory leaflet about the voucher scheme. Vouchers are not issued to Commonwealth citizens who are already in the United Kingdom. The issue of vouchers by the Department of Employment and Productivity is strictly controlled at a rate determined from time to time by the Government, and consequently there is a waiting list for vouchers. To allow a person admitted as a visitor to stay and take work would defeat the purpose of the voucher scheme, and would be unfair to those Commonwealth citizens who are waiting their turn for vouchers abroad.

You are not entitled to remain here and there are no grounds for according you exceptional treatment. The Secretary of State regrets that he cannot, therefore, allow you to remain here for employment and has granted an extension of stay until 31 December 1969; in order that you may wind up your affairs and make necessary arrangements for your departure by that date.
